BC Cattlemen's Association (BCCA) has a number of bursaries and scholarships to provide financial assistance to students wishing to further their education. Money is raised annually through an auction at BCCA's annual meeting, with matching contributions from the Beef Cattle Industry Development Fund. Application Deadline for 2016-17 school year: April 15

BCCA bursaries (\$1,000 each):

- BC Cattlemen's Association bursaries
- Marin Riedemann Annual Bursary
- Rob Starr Memorial Bursary
- RBC Dominion Securities-Criterion Capital Group Bursary

CRITERIA:

- * Students must be related to a BCCA member
- * Students must be enrolled in, or entering post-secondary education in any field of study
- * Bursaries may be used for non-traditional post-secondary education such as learning a trade

Bostock and Fallis Families of Monte Creek Heritage Fund Bursary (\$2,000 each)

CRITERIA:

- * Graduation from a secondary school within B.C.
- * Reside east of a line from Hope to Terrace.
- * Enrolled in any desired field of study

The Bostock and Fallis families, long-time ranching families in the Monte Creek area have established a fund through the BC Interior Community Foundation to award two annual bursaries of \$2,000 each, as well as provide donation to charities within the area serviced by the BC Interior Community Foundation. These bursaries are intended to provide financial assistance to students who can show financial need and wish to further post-secondary education in Canada.

Gung Loy Jim Scholarship (\$2,000 each)

Established in 2003 by the Jim family, the Gung Loy Jim scholarship aims to give back to the cattle industry and encourage the ranchers of tomorrow. Little Fort Herefords continues as a thriving purebred & commercial family ranch in Little Fort, British Columbia, run by the Jim family.

Two scholarships are awarded each year. The purpose of this scholarship is to assist worthy students from British Columbia, especially those from rural areas where cattle are raised, to further his/her education in whichever field they desire.

CRITERIA

- * Students must be from B.C.
- * Must be enrolled in, or plan to attend a post-secondary institution in Canada
- * Preference will be given to students from rural areas where cattle are raised.

Brian Hill Memorial Scholarship presented by Ownership Identification Inc. (\$500 each)

CRITERIA

- * Must be resident of B.C.
- * Must be entering agriculture or a related field of study
- * May or may not have been a 4-H member
- * Enrolled in, or attending recognized college or university in Canada or the U.S.
